## VIII. Action Items

### A. 2025 June Financial Report

M/S Hestwood/Kimpton to accept the 2025 June Financial Report through June 30, 2025.  
Motion passed unanimously.

The 2025 Preliminary June Financial Report reflects an ADM of 314. This is 36 ADM below the original budget adopted for the current fiscal year and 1 ADM below the revised budget. The budget was revised during FY25 to reflect revenues and expenditures aligned with 315 ADM. SPCPA continued to maintain a healthy fund balance and adequate days of cash on hand to meet its debt service coverage ratio, a requirement of the bonds that pertain to the school's facilities in the Lowry, throughout FY25. The school anticipates ending FY25 with at least a surplus of approximately \$147,114.

### B. 2025 August Financial Report

M/S Kimpton/Haug to accept the 2025 August Financial Report through August 31, 2025.  
Motion passed unanimously.

The 2025 August Financial Report reflects an ADM of 311. This is 11 ADM above the budget adopted for the current school year based on 300 ADM. The budget will be revised if ADM drops below 300. SPCPA continues to maintain a healthy fund balance and adequate days of cash on hand to meet its debt service coverage ratio, a requirement of the bonds that pertain to the school's facilities in the Lowry. The school has also received approximately 16% of revenues and is 17% of the way through the fiscal year with 11% of expenditures dispersed. The current anticipated surplus for the year is estimated to be at least \$149,507.

### C. SY25-26 Q Comp Goals

M/S Bettison/Kimpton to accept the Q Comp Goals for SY25-26.  
Motion passed unanimously.

The percentage of all students enrolled as of October 1, 2025, in grade 11 at the Saint Paul Conservatory for Performing Artists who earn an achievement level of Meets the Standard or Exceeds the Standard in Mathematics on state accountability tests (MCA and MTAS), will increase from 31.5% to 90% for the 2025-2026 school year.

The percentage of all students enrolled as of October 1, 2025, in grade 10 at the Saint Paul Conservatory for Performing Artists who earn an achievement level of Meets the Standard or Exceeds the Standard in Reading on state accountability tests (MCA and MTAS), will increase from 80.4% to 90% for the 2025-2026 school year.

The percentage of all students enrolled as of October 1, 2024, in grade 11 at the Saint Paul Conservatory for Performing Artists who earn an achievement level of Meets the Standard or Exceeds the Standard in Science on state accountability tests (MCA and MTAS), will increase from TBD% to 90% for the 2025-2026 school year.

D. Grades 9-12 Health Standards & Course Credit

M/S Keeley/Kimpton to adopt the Health Standards, as presented, required to meet the local graduation requirement of .4 credit. Motion passed unanimously.

E. Grades 9-12 Physical Education Standards & Course Credit

M/S Hestwood/Judge to adopt the local graduation requirement of .4 credit aligned to the Minnesota Academic Standards for Physical Education required for grades 9-12. Motion passed unanimously.

F. External User Recertification System – Identified Official with Authority (IOwA)

M/S Bettison/Hestwood to authorize Callie Jacobs to act as the Identified Official with Authority (IOwA) for the Saint Paul Conservatory for Performing Artists (#4112). Motion passed unanimously.

The Minnesota Department of Education (MDE), Professional Educator Licensing Standards Board (PELSB), and Office of Higher Education (OHE) require annual designation of an Identified Official with Authority (IOwA) for each local education agency that uses the Education Identity Access Management (EDIAM) system. The IOwA is responsible for authorizing, reviewing, and recertifying user access for their local education agency in accordance with the State of Minnesota Enterprise Identity and Access Management Standard, which states that all user access rights to Minnesota state systems must be reviewed and recertified at least annually. The Identified Official with Authority will authorize user access to State of Minnesota Education secure systems in accordance with the user's assigned job duties and will revoke that user's access when it is no longer needed to perform their job duties. The IOwA may designate a proxy.

G. SY26-27 Admissions – Policy, Procedures, & Important Dates

M/S Judge/Kimpton to approve accepting applications for SY26-27 beginning September 1, 2025. The first round of invitations to enroll will then be sent to students that apply by or before February 1, 2026 in accordance with Policy 513: Admissions. Motion passed unanimously.

## **IX. Reports & Discussion**

### **A. Reports: SY25-26 Enrollment Summary & SY26-27 Application Summary**

Superintendent Jacobs presented the 2025-2026 Enrollment Summary. There are currently 311 students enrolled. Enrollment is lower than the prior year and ADM will continue to be monitored closely throughout the school year.

### **B. Reports: Administrative Updates**

Principal Goranson shared the results of the ACT and MCAs administered in SY24-25, provided the Board with an update regarding J-Term 2026, and a summary of events pertaining to the start of the new school year.

Principal Goranson shared with the Board his resignation effective June 30, 2026. He explained working in K-12 education has become increasingly difficult for him post-COVID and plans to return to a full-time career in the performing arts for a few years prior to retiring. The Board expressed deep gratitude for Principal Goranson's 21 years of service to SPCPA and extended warm wishes for his future.

Superintendent Jacobs provided an update regarding ongoing facilities issues in the building some of which have required engagement of SPCPA's legal counsel, necessary upgrades to the school's access and security systems, and additional legislative mandates for FY25-26.

### **C. Reports: Authorizer – New Requirements & Renewal**

SPCPA is currently beginning the process to renew its contract with the University of St. Thomas (UST), its Authorizer, which expires on June 30, 2026. There are several new requirements for both authorizers and schools that will be addressed during the process. The school will host the UST renewal team for a site visit on November 12, 2025. The initial draft of SPCPA's renewal application will be submitted in early February.
